10 Minute Table Runner

Supply List:

10-12 inches of "theme" print, Width of fabric (wof)

18 inches of a coordinating print, Width of fabric (wof)

Sewing supplies: machine, thread, and any other notions you may need

Easy Pillowcase

Supply List:

Fabric to make one pillow case (double amount if you want to make two):

Standard – 27" length WOF for main print

Queen - 29" length WOF for main print

King - 31" length WOF for main print

9" WOF fabric for the cuff

1 1/4" WOF for trim color

Sewing supplies: machine, thread, and any other notions you may need

Christmas Ornament

Supply List:

2 ½" by 2" coordinating Christmas strips (approximately 44-50 2 ½" strips to fold)

Ribbon or material to wrap around ornament (9 1/2") and hanging loop (length is up to individual making the ornament)

Ribbon for a bow optional.

Foam balls and pins provided

Sock Snowman

Supply List:

White tube or crew sock (provided for class)

Rice – approximately 3 cups for each Snowman (provided for class)

Rubber Bands (provided for class)

Fabric scissors

Glue Gun

Pom-Poms, buttons, Christmas ribbon, fabric scraps for a scarf, or any other items you'd like to use to decorate your Snowman. If you are going to put a "sweater" on it, you will need a colored sock (I used a Christmas sock).

If you want your Snowman to have a nose, get an orange pipe cleaner.

I used pins with a colored head for the eyes and mouth.

This is another quilt from Barbara's sister. The technic is rough edged applique. It measures 68 X 68 inches. It was quilted by Joanne Hinkle.




This Patriotic Quilt was donated by the Honor Quilt Group. It measures 63 X 62.5 and was quilted by Cindy Konarski.
