Therapy Day, November 13, 2023 at 10:00 AM – Quilted Sweatshirt by Judy Cobb Abernathy

If you have not already signed up, and would like to attend, please contact Linda Henson or Judy Cobb Abernathy.

Supply List:

- 1 Sweatshirt any color 1 size larger than you wear
- 2 yards fabric (estimate) sleeveless
- 3 yards fabric (estimate) long sleeves
- Options:
 - o A) Strips any size OR
 - o B) Jellyroll OR
 - C) Scraps/scrap blocks and/or pieces enough to cover
- Coordinating thread to sew and quilt
- Narrow 18" or 24" ruler
- Scissors
- Pins
- Marking Pen (dark for light color sweatshirt or light for dark color sweatshirt)
- 2" bias binding to finish edges (110" to 120" approximately depending on the sweatshirt size)
- Sewing Machine
- Other normal sewing supplies


