You must have the color of the Birthstone and the Flower for your birth month in your quilt top. It does not need to be appliqued, as long as the flower is in the fabric. Quilt must be no less than 100" and no more than 200". Must be done by the entrant and quilted by the entrant.

The Label must contain the flowers and the color of your birth month.




Veterans News
