Later this year Karel Johnson will teach this tree skirt class. To take advantage of the after Christmas sales, you might consider looking around now for fabric. To make a skirt with the three tiers as shown here you will need:

1/3 yd of each of 6 different fabrics for inner and outer fins (red). (you can also use 8 or 4 different fabrics as long as that number divides evenly into 24, the number of blades)
1 fat quarter of each of 6 different fabrics for middle fins (green) (again 8 or 4 works also)
<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yd of each of 2 different fabrics to make the reversible back.
