Date: January 22, 2024

Minutes: A motion to approve the minutes of December 11, 2023 was passed.

Our April Therapy Day will be JoAnn Estes teaching us how to do the Pick Up Sticks pattern by strip tubing. A supply list is included below. Also included on the supply list page is where you can get the ruler which will be needed. It is \$10.79 on Amazon. If you print out the sheet, please print it in color so you can better see the ruler that is required.



Pick Up Sticks 70" x 81" JoAnn Estes, Instructor

Supply List:

- 36 Dark/Medium 2 ¹/₂" x Width of Fabric strips (Minimum of 42")
- 44 Light 2 ¹/₂" x Width of Fabric strips (Minimum of 42")
- or 3 1/3 yards light background fabric (this includes fabric for 2" inner border)
- 2 yds. Dark fabric for outer border and binding
- 90 degree triangle ruler (I use the Omnigrid right triangle for 8" quilting ruler). It can be found on Amazon for \$10.79
- Sewing Machine (with extra thread and bobbins)
- Seam Ripper (Must have for this method of assembly)
- Iron/Ironing Board (Optional Can use the ones provided in class)
- Rotary Cutter/Cutting Mat
- Assorted quilting supplies as you think you will need... (Pins, scissors, etc.)

NOTE: If buying yardage for this quilt, please have several 2 ¹/₂" light and dark strips cut prior to coming to class.


