Therapy Day Information – May 12 Quilt as You Go Homespun or Any Fabric You Wish

Finished size approx 50" x 60" 99 blocks – make more or fewer for different sizes

Precut blocks before class:

- 1. 99 6" fabric blocks approx 2 ¼ yd if using yardage
- 2. 99 6" squares of batting
- 3. 99 8" squares of fabric approx 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ yd if using yardage

Matching thread
Sewing machine
Walking foot
Regular foot
Cutting mat and rotary cutter
Ruler
Scissors
Fabric marker

You can use homespun or any fabric – you want it scrappy. It's a fun and fast quilt
