Danette asked if the Quilt Guild could make a very large tree skirt in red and gold for a tree at the hospital. Cindy Konarski volunteered to head a committee to make the tree skirt by Thanksgiving.

Date: September 22, 2025

Visitors/Guests: A recent new member, Karen Wiggins, stood and was introduced.

Minutes: The minutes of the August 25, 2025 meeting and luncheon were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Judy Pearson reported a beginning balance of \$7,214.05 with \$345.00 income and \$379.61 in Quilt Show expenses. That leaves us with a balance of \$7,179.44. The annual dues of \$25 will be collected beginning in October.

Special Announcement: Judy Pearson invited members of the Guild to her wedding here at the Senior Center on Saturday, October 11th at 1:00.

Nancy Harris read the By-laws and after discussion, the group concluded that Judy Pearson cannot serve an additional term. Judy explained the roles of the duty and gratefully, Joanne Hinkle volunteered to serve as treasurer.

Newsletter: Nancy asked that all articles should be turned in by Thursday this week.

Programs: The October 13 Therapy Day is changed to making tote bags out of two placemats. The November 24 program will be a Trunk Show by Nolita Wacaster.

Other Announcements:

Patsy asked for ideas for the "challenge" next year.

Linda Henson thanked all the Quilt Show members. She reminded members to help take down quilts and sign out quilts on Monday, September 29, between 9:00-11:00 a.m. There will be a "Post-Show" meeting on Monday, October 6 at 10:00 here at the Senior Center for those on the Quilt Show Committee.

Judy Salchow's ladder is missing at Comma.

After asking how we could be more proactive about publicizing the Quilt Show, suggestions were made for flyers at local (50 mile radius) quilt shops, advertising in "Downtown to you" on line and to reach out to the Morganton Festival committee.

Judy Abernethy mentioned that Michael Burley asked for quilts for "Art in the Hall" to be displayed at the City Hall for "America 250". The quilts will be displayed during October and November 2026. Karel Johnson said the Historical Society has a special display and that might be a great place to get an idea for a quilt.

Show and Tell: We enjoyed seeing crocheted animals, a quilt for a granddaughter, a few donation baby quilts and a framed batik donkey. Thanks for showing your work!

Guest Speaker: Jenny Cook, of Bill's Sewing, applauded the members of the Guild for all the beautiful quilts at the Quilt Show! Jenny joined this guild in 1987 when they were meeting in homes. Jenny showed us how a Serger machine can be a fast way to make donation quilts. She stressed the importance of pressing seams to the same direction. She also explained ways to square a quilt, measuring from the middle and both sides then averaging the distance. Other tips she gave us were: Use the same ruler for cutting throughout a project and make sure you have a new blade when cutting your quilt pieces! Jenny showed us how to cut fabric straight using a two ruler method. Thanks for your tips, Jenny!



Supplies for the October 13 bag class


Glenda Hoffman will lead the October 13 Therapy Day.
